Course Description: Driver education is a three-phase course.

Course Title: Driver Education

Phase 1 – Classroom: Student will receive at least thirty (30 hours in the classroom instruction and independent study. This opportunity will help the student understand the rules, laws, and ordinances of the road. It will also provide him/her with the knowledge and the development of positive attitude and habits that are acceptable to traffic situations. The teacher will strive to prepare each student for the eventualities he/she will encounter while driving

Phase 2 – **Driving Range:** All students will receive at least two (2) hours of range instruction and addition hours of observation. The driving range includes an off-the-street driving area under teacher supervision and observed by other students. The teacher has direct communication with each driver.

Phase 3 – On-the-Road Driving: All students will receive at least four (4) hours actual driving and additional hours of observation. On-street driving instruction provides the students with the opportunity to perform driving tasks under supervised and controlled situations. The students learn the proper procedure to control the automobile while interacting with other highway users in real traffic environment.

Fees: Knox County Schools charges a fee of \$125.00 per student to take driver education. This money helps to cover the cost of leasing the cars, up keep on these cars and insurance. This fee could increase at anytime.

Supplies: Students will need a three (3) clip / two (2) pocket folder, paper and at least two (2) pens or pencils (pencils would be better). This, along with their books should be brought to class everyday.
