2 week Extended School Year (ESY) and 6 week Credit Recovery

Process:

1. A student, who fails a class with a percent greater than a 50, will qualify for one of two summer school options.
Option A - If grade is a 60-69 student may attend two week ESY (May 25-June 10)
Option B – If grade is 50-59 students may attend six week Credit Recovery (May 25-July 8)
2. Student will return completed application to the main or Young campus office by May 18th.
3. Students may only take Recovery Credit or ESY classes to replace classes in which they failed.
4. The new grade will be computed by combining the current grade and the summer school grade.
5. A Grade Change Form will then be completed by the summer school teacher and returned to the school counselor.

Courses available for Credit Recovery:

- English I, II, III, and IV, Algebra I, II, Geometry, Advanced Algebra and Trig, Bridge Math, AP Calculus
- Phy Science, Biology, Chemistry, Physics, Ecology, AP Biology,
- US Hist, US Gov, World History, Econ, Personal Finance, AP US Gov

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STUDENT INFORMATION AND RULES

All rules are strictly enforced.

NO EARLY DISMISSAL FROM CLASS.

TARDINESS. Students will be dropped from summer school on the sixth tardy. Drive

All assigned work must be completed to receive credit.

All fees must be paid on the first day of class. Fees are non-refundable.

Students must abide by all school rules and Knox County Schools board policy.

Credit Recovery Courses: All classes will be taken online with. Every student will be required to attend class from 8:30 until 12:00 for the first 10 days. If adequate progress is shown, the student may then choose to complete coursework from home or any remote location. All students will return to school to complete the end of course test. If the student fails to show continued progress while working from home, he/she will be required to return to school to complete work.

Make-up credit: Students may make up a full-unit grade of "C", "D", or "F" received by completing the online course work and the End-of-Course test. Courses in which students earned a grade of either "A" or "B" may not repeat a course in summer school. If a student does not complete the online course in summer school, he/she may continue the coursework with the permission of the principal. The principal will determine the date and time by which the coursework must be completed.

Grades/Credit: A progress report will be issued at the end of the first 10 days. A cumulative numerical percent will be reported when the coursework and End-of-Course test are completed. Grades will be calculated using the Knox County Schools' guidelines for recovery credit. Please note: State End of Course tests will not be administered in summer school.

Attendance: NO ABSENCES permitted! In order to earn the privilege of working at home, students must be in full attendance the first 10 days.

Transportation: Transportation is the responsibility of the student and family.

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
