You will be accountable for your talks in Flight Time next year. Assignment:

Listen to three TED talks and complete a TED data sheet in its entirety for each talk. Each data sheet will be a 30 point Flight Time grade for a total of 90 points due the first week of fall semester. This assignment contains a list of approved TED talks. You may pick <u>ALL THREE</u> from the approved list, or you may listen to <u>TWO</u> from the approved list and <u>ONE</u> of your own choice.

Parent Permission Note:

The TED talks on the list have been reviewed as appropriate for a high school audience; with that said, we would like your parents to sign each of your Data Sheets. This signature serves a few purposes: 1) The signature serves as parent permission approving each talk. 2) The signature lets your parents know that you have summer work and that you are being a "good kid" and doing your summer work. 3) At its purest and finest form, the signature lets you and your family explore the world of TED talks together. They are great conversation starters.

TED talks will be viewed on-line. You can get to them with almost any device (computer, tablet, or phone). Please note, the Knox County Public Library has free Internet access. Also, Mrs. Reynolds will be on campus throughout the summer and invites any family needing Internet access to contact her at the school and she will make arrangements to open our computer labs as needed for students to work on this assignment.
