# FAQ for Dual Enrollment at Bearden High School 2017-2018

## What is Dual Enrollment at Bearden High School?

- Dual Enrollment (DE) takes place when a high school student is enrolled in high school and college simultaneously. In other words, the student is approved for getting high school and college credit for the same class.
- > Only **rising juniors** and rising **seniors** can apply to take DE courses. Dual Enrollment provides a means for high school students to accelerate their college education and get a feel for what learning will be like in college.
- Most BHS DE students take classes through Pellissippi State. With the help of the Dual Enrollment Grant, this process can save students time and money.
- ➤ DE classes are 2-3 days a week. DE courses taken off campus or online are scheduled during 1<sup>st</sup> or 5<sup>h</sup> block and **must be preapproved by your school counselor**. When the student is not attending a DE class, the student is permitted to come in late or leave early.

#### **What is the Dual Enrollment Grant?**

- The TN Dual Enrollment Grant program is a grant for the study that is funded from net proceeds of the state lottery and awarded to students who are attending high school and are also enrolled in another college/institution.
- For rising *juniors and seniors*, the grant will pay \$500 for your 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> DE class. The amount will drop to \$200 for the 3<sup>rd</sup> and will not cover a 4<sup>th</sup> class. To remain eligible for the grant, students **must maintain at least a 2.75 average in their DE courses.**

#### What are the Dual Enrollment Qualifications?

- 1) Only rising juniors and seniors can take Dual Enrollment courses.
- 2) To qualify for General Education courses such as English 1010 and Psychology, students must have:
  - 3.0 or higher un-weighted GPA (no exceptions) AND one of the following
    - o ACT Reading score 19 or higher/ ACT English score 18 or higher
    - o PSAT/SAT of 500 on Evidenced-Based Reading and Writing

# What DE courses can BHS students take on the BHS campus?

English 1010 - Can count for English IV for HS & Freshman College English 1010 (limited seating)

English 1020 - Can count for Freshman College English 1020 (limited seating) English 1010 is a prerequisite

Psychology 1030 - Can count for a Humanities elective credit and College Psychology

#### What DE courses can BHS students take off BHS campus or online?

All DE courses taken off the BHS campus or online <u>must</u> be pre-approved by your school counselor. **Please consult the Pellissippi State website for a comprehensive list of Dual Enrollment Courses.** 

## **Important Information:**

- Dual Enrollment courses NOT offered at Bearden High School MUST receive prior approval from the Guidance Office.
- > Beginning with class of 2015, pre-approved "Core" Dual Enrollment courses will receive AP weight. A "Core" dual enrollment course is defined as one that is the curriculum equivalent to, or one that exceeds an Advanced Placement course (as defined by The College Board) or is a college level course that would be listed in the High School Curriculum Guide. Dual Enrollment Psychology **DOES** receive AP weight.
- All eligibility requirements and pre-approvals for dual enrollment MUST be met or students will be dropped from taking the dual enrollment course.
- > Students are responsible for checking with colleges and universities to see how DE courses transfer.
- > Bearden does not have access to a student's DE grades throughout the semester. The student is considered a college student and therefore, their educational information is confidential and can not be shared with parents unless the student signs the post-secondary institution's form permitting this information be released.
