Employment and Community First CHOICES is a TennCare program for individuals with intellectual and other developmental disabilities. This program is designed to provide the

support you need in your own home or in the community. These are called Home and Community Based Services or HCBS. Services in Employment and Community First CHOICES will help you plan for and get a job, and live as independently as possible in the community. They will help you do things in the community that you want to do – to help you build relationships and reach your goals. If you live at home with your family, they will also help your family support you in planning for and reaching your goals. BlueCare Tennessee is your TennCare health plan. We're sometimes called your Managed Care Organization or MCO. We will help you get the services you need in Employment and Community First CHOICES. We will also help you with your physical or behavioral health care (mental health, alcohol, and drug abuse services).
