RANK AND GRADE POINT AVERAGES: The class ranks are determined by computing the weighted grade-point average of each student at the end of seven (7) semesters beginning with the freshman year of high school. GPA's are based upon the 4.0 system with an additional 1/2 quality point for Honors classes. The Advanced Placement and Dual Enrollment courses are weighted with an additional 1 quality point. The valedictorian and salutatorian are identified. **The Knox County School system requires that all rankings be reported as deciles.**
