Test Data Released from the TNDOE

Our parents may have seen the recent release of test data from 2016-2017 from the Tennessee Department of Education (TNDOE). Rocky Hill **scored a 5 in growth overall** and was very competitive with other Knox County Schools and with other schools in our state.

- English Lang. Arts (3rd-5th) % On Grade Level or Mastered = 61.6%
- Math (3rd-5th) % On Grade Level or Mastered = 66.5%
- Science (3rd-5th) % On Grade Level or Mastered = 78.6%

We have a lot to be proud of and we are committed to working even harder this year to raise the % of students who perform *On Grade Level* or *Mastered* in each content area.

Safety and Technology

Many thanks to our RHES Foundation for providing the funding for a walkie-talkie for every staff member! In addition, there will be new laptops for teachers in order to effectively utilize the new ActivBoards purchased last year for each classroom.
