# Frequently Asked Questions

#### Will there be a graduation ceremony? Awards Ceremony?

We are working to develop a plan for graduation, but it is too early to tell what it will look like, or when it will be at this time? An awards ceremony is not likely, but we are working on alternative plans to honor our academic achievers. We have not received word yet on what stipulations Knox County will place on large gatherings, so we do not have plans for a Prom yet.

#### Book returns and device returns?

We do not have a plan yet, but most likely there will be some sort of drive through return process in May. If not May, it could be pushed back until late summer.

#### Yearbook pickup? Senior Supply pickup?

KCS will provide authorization for when these pickups happen, but a plan is not in place at this time.

#### Student locker clean out?

A locker clean out day in which students come to the school is not likely. Schools are closed and students cannot be allowed to enter. We will communicate about personal artifacts when we have more information.

## KCS@Home and Grades

KCS and your student's teachers have already sent out communication about KCS@Home, so here is a brief summary.

You've heard that students have two options. (1) To allow their grades to stand as of March 12th and accept that grade as the final class average, or (2) to work on assignments provided by the teacher or the school district in an attempt to raise their grade prior to May 18th. Students/families should communicate their choice to each of the teachers before April 29th in the manner which the teacher has requested. If no communication is received, the student's choice will default to the first option. Students will not earn a grade lower than what it was on March 12th, regardless of their choice. All work must be submitted online in the manner requested by the teacher.

#### Nine-Week classes and grades

Students enrolled in 9-week classes will receive a grade for their Quarter 3 course. The Q3 courses will also offer the opportunity to work on review materials as part of KCS@Home. The Quarter 4 course will not issue grades or provide materials.

Seniors scheduled to take Economics during Q4 will have the option to take it online as a Pass/Fail course, which offers a credit that does not calculate into the overall GPA. Further information will come out this week.

## **Closed Campus**

Due to the continued gatherings of large groups of students and community members on the football field during the Stay-at-Home order, we will lock all campus access gates except for

Monday and Wednesday mornings during food distribution times. As a reminder, all athletic fields are to be used by reservation only through HHS/KCS. We appreciate your cooperation.

# **AP Exam Updates**

#### **Exam Dates**

- Exams will be given from May 11-22.
- Makeup test dates will be available for each subject from June 1–5.
- Students can take exams at home or in schools, if they reopen.
- Each subject's exam will be taken on the same day at the same time, worldwide.

#### **Exam Format**

- Most exams will have one or two free-response questions, and each question will be timed separately. Students will need to write and submit their responses within the allotted time for each question.
- Students will be able to take exams on any device they have access to—computer, tablet, or smartphone. They'll be able to type and upload their responses or write responses by hand and submit a photo via their cell phones.
- For most subjects, the exams will be 45 minutes long, plus an additional 5 minutes for uploading. Students will need to access the online testing system 30 minutes early to get set up.
- Certain courses—Art and Design: 2D; Art and Design: 3D; Computer Science Principles; Drawing; Research; and Seminar—will use portfolio submissions and will not have a separate online exam. All deadlines for these submissions have been extended to May 26, 2020, 11:59 p.m. ET. Teachers and students may receive separate course-specific communications.
- Students taking world language and culture exams will complete two spoken tasks consistent with free-response questions 3 and 4 on the current AP Exam. Written responses will not be required. We'll provide additional details in the coming weeks to help students prepare.
