



Courses: Art I

- Advanced Art
- 3D-Art Design
- Honors Art (Honors credit)
- A.P. Art (Honors credit/ College Board Portfolio)

(FINE ART CREDIT)

Art I: This course is an introduction to visual art. A variety of mediums (materials) will be explored along with art history integrated into the course. Students will have an opportunity to explore ideas or themes into their projects. Students do not have to have prior art courses to take this course.

Advanced Art: (Art 1 is a prerequisite)

It is a more hands on course with the individual's creativity being the forefront of the assignments. Assignments will be approached with a concept, but students will have a more open-ended solution to fulfilling the projects assigned. Students will continue learning how to incorporate multiple approaches around one central concept.

3D Art Design: (Art 1 is a prerequisite)

This course is set up to teach students about three-dimensional design. Whether it be sculpture-in-the-round or linear perspective, this course is loaded with useful information for computer design, drafting, architecture, sculptural 3d designing, or ceramics.

Media Art: (Art 1 is a prerequisite)

This course is a combination of learning digital computer art as well as in class projects that mirror the idea of a digital project.

(HONORS COURSE CREDIT): (Art 1, & Adv Art prerequisite)

(Year Long Course) "Skinny"

Honors Art: This class is set up to prepare students for college level art courses. The content in this course will be collage based and be set up like a 101 studio class at a University. Students should expect rigorous content and pacing. Students will need to work on course work at home on a daily basis to succeed.

The art production at this level should set students up to succeed in the A.P Art course College Board Portfolio.

A.P.Art: (Art 1 & Adv. Art prerequisite)

(11th & 12th grade students only)

(Year Long Course) "Skinny"

This is a college level course that counts for an honors level course. This class is a very intensive year round course.

Students should prepare to work on art projects at home daily because of the 45 minute "skinny" course.

Students will create a portfolio of their work and it will be submitted at the end of the school year to College Board for grading.

(College Board: The same A.P. site for honors testing in academic courses.)
