Tiger Rock Community Day builds relationships with law enforcement

It was one fantastic moment after another as more than 120 Cedar Bluff Elementary students gathered at Tiger Rock Martial Arts of West Knoxville for the fifth annual Tiger Rock Community Day held in conjunction with the Knox County Sheriff's Office on Saturday, Aug. 19.

Cedar Bluff Elementary staffers opened the event-filled day by breaking boards to the delight of the kids, who cheered particularly loudly for assistant principal Tara Howell-Spikes.

Canine officers Rocky and Dany were on hand to wow the kids with demonstrations of narcotics sniffing and taking down a bad guy played by sheriff's Officer Chris Wallace.

The bomb squad was on hand, and there were raffle winners every few minutes, but the most popular attraction was UT Lifestar, which caused squeals of delight as it landed in the parking lot to give the kids a tour of the helicopter.

Co-owner Josh Hazelip said the day was successful in helping build relationships with local law enforcement.

"It was a super successful day. People had a lot of fun even though we covered some serious topics. We ended the day with stranger danger and anti-bullying seminar. Plus, the parents had the opportunity to get an ID kit containing fingerprints and a current photo of their child.

"Most specifically, it was important to me that we use the day to help build positive relationships with the Sheriff's Department given the current atmosphere we have in this country. I was really hoping to demonstrate to the kids in a positive manner that the police are here to help them.

"They got to see and interact with several police officers in different areas of the Sheriff's Department from narcotics to the bomb squad. They learned that there's nothing to fear from a narcotics dog, which they may see in school ... unless you're a bad guy, that is.

"I wanted the kids to see and learn that law

enforcement is here to help. A police officer is your buddy."

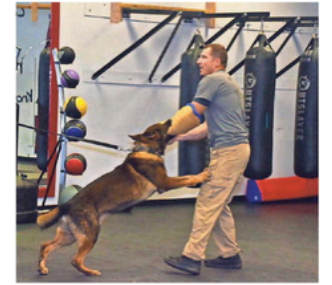

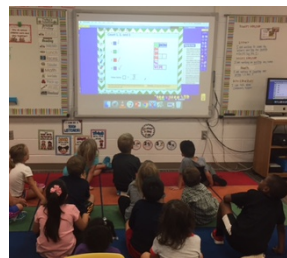
