Students, before you apply to any of these scholarships, please go to the listed scholarship websites and double-check application deadlines. Mistakes can happen so please verify deadlines and requirements.

One of the best sources of scholarship and financial aid information is the Financial Aid and Scholarship Office at the college to which you are applying. Be sure to visit each college's website and follow that individual school's instructions regarding any required forms and/or deadlines.

Knox Co PTA Scholarships

Applications are available in the counseling office.

Deadline to apply is January 20, 2020 (Please allow 5 business days for mailed delivery)

Jack Kent Cooke Foundation

Scholarships can open doors for students who aspire to go to college but don't have the funds. The Jack Kent Cooke Foundation's College Scholarship Program is an undergraduate scholarship program available to high-achieving high school seniors with financial need who seek to attend and graduate from the nation's best four-year colleges and universities. In addition to the monetary award, Cooke Scholars receive comprehensive educational advising, significant cohort-based programming, and graduate school funding, as well as access to a thriving network of more than 2,600 fellow Cooke Scholars and alumni. The Cooke Foundation College Scholarship Program application (exclusively through the Common App) closes November 13, 2019.

State Scholarships

The Tennessee Student Assistance Award Program (TSAA)

Funds are awarded on a first-come, first-served basis. To be eligible, the applicant must complete a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA), be a Tennessee resident, and have a valid Expected Family Contribution (EFC) of \$2100 or less. Because funds are limited, interested students are strongly encouraged to apply as soon as possible after October 1st. Awards are made until funds are depleted. For more information, go here. Deadline: As soon as possible after October 1, 2019. The application for this scholarship is the FAFSA.

The Tennessee Promise

Tennessee Promise is both a scholarship and mentoring program. It will provide students a last-dollar scholarship, meaning the scholarship will cover tuition and fees not covered by the Pell grant, the HOPE scholarship, or TSAA funds. Students may use the scholarship at any of the state's 13 community colleges, 27 colleges of applied technology, or other eligible institution offering an associate's degree program. While removing the financial burden is key, a critical component of Tennessee Promise is the individual guidance each participant will receive from a mentor who will assist the student as he or she navigates the college admissions process. In addition, Tennessee Promise participants must complete eight hours of community service per term enrolled, as well as maintain satisfactory academic progress (2.0 GPA) at their institution. The student must be a current high school senior to apply. More information and a link to the application can be found here.

Deadline: November 1, 2019

The Tennessee Education Lottery Scholarship Program offers the HOPE Scholarship Award (requirement of 21 ACT/SAT equivalent OR 3.0 final GPA & based upon full-time enrollment: 2-year college: \$1,500 per semester, 4-year college freshmen/sophomores amount is \$1,750 per semester, 4-year college juniors/seniors amount is \$2,250 per semester), the General Assembly Merit Scholarship (up to \$500 per semester supplement to the HOPE scholarship), the Aspire Award (up to \$750 per semester supplement to the HOPE scholarship for 4-year institutions; up to \$250/semester for 2-year institutions), and the Hope Access Grant (up to \$1,250 per semester for 4-year institutions; up to \$875 per semester for 2-year institutions) to qualified students. Additional HOPE monies include the Wilder-Naifeh Technical Skills Grant and the Tennessee HOPE Foster Child Tuition Grant. Parents and students who want to know more about the HOPE Scholarships and the Tennessee Education Lottery Scholarship Programs should go here.

Important explanation of Lottery Scholarship grade point average: TSAC, who administers the HOPE Scholarship, uses the phrase "a 3.0 weighted GPA" in all of their literature. What TSAC calls a weighted GPA is what Knox County considers an unweighted GPA. A 'TN State Lottery GPA' is now listed on the Knox County Schools electronic transcript.

Ned McWherter Scholars Program

The Ned McWherter Scholars Program is intended to encourage academically superior Tennessee high school graduates to attend college in Tennessee. Tennessee high school seniors starting their last semester in high school may apply. To be eligible, the applicant must:

Be a resident of Tennessee, a U.S. citizen or permanent resident, attend an eligible Tennessee college or university full time, and have at least a 3.5 unweighted cumulative grade point average, and have a minimum composite score of 29 on the ACT/SAT equivalent.

The award is \$6,000 per academic year, \$3,000 from the State of Tennessee and \$3,000 from the college or university attended. Awards are made in equal installments each term throughout the academic year. The award may be renewed three times for a total of four years. The recipient must maintain at least a 3.2 cumulative grade point average and attend full-time to remain eligible.

Dependent Children Scholarship Program

- Residents who are <u>dependent children of a Tennessee law enforcement officer</u>, <u>fireman</u>, <u>or an emergency medical service technician who has been killed or totally and permanently disabled</u> while performing duties within the scope of such employment. The parent must be a Tennessee resident and have been on duty when the incident occurred. The scholarship is awarded to full-time undergraduate students attending eligible Tennessee institutions.
 - award amount varies and depends on available funds

*For the HOPE and other scholarships, students must **submit the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)**. The FAFSA should be filed as soon as possible after October 1st of a student's senior year. Students will need their Social Security number, driver's license, income tax return, bank statements and investment records before filling out the form.

Scholarships that require Nominations

PLEASE READ THE FOLLOWING FIRST:

In order to be considered for one of these scholarships, students must apply to the L&N STEM Academy Scholarship Nomination Committee. Pick up a Nomination Request Form or download one from the school counseling web page (L&N website, under School Counseling, College & Career, forms), complete the requirements and return the entire package to the School Counseling Office next to the plaza by the deadline date. DO NOT SUBMIT YOUR APPLICATION DIRECTLY TO THE SCHOOL OR ORGANIZATION. YOU MUST BE SELECTED AS THE L&N NOMINEE FIRST. L&N THEN SUBMITS THE PACKET. Selected students will be notified by their counselor who will provide information on the next step. The deadlines listed below reflect enough time for the committee to review all submissions, make their selection and then meet the school or organization's deadline. You must meet the deadline listed.

The University of Dayton – Leadership in Service Scholarship

The University of Dayton challenges its students to connect scholarship and learning with leadership and service, developing individuals into servant leaders. The scholarship is worth \$10,000 (\$2,500 per year for four years). In order to maintain the LIS Scholarship, participants must complete a leadership opportunity each semester through Student Leadership Programs. While the student needs to meet their admission standards, the scholarship is not necessarily awarded on GPA and test scores. They are looking for a student who has an innate desire for personal development and is committed to service within his or her school, church, or community. For more information, go here. To be considered as the L&N nominee, fill out an L&N Scholarship Nomination Form.

Deadline: November 1, 2019

Prudential Spirit of Community Awards

The applicant must be a US Citizen or legal resident. Students in grades 5-12 must have engaged in a volunteer activity within the last year (an activity which demonstrated exemplary community service). The top applicant in the state will receive an unrestricted award of \$1,000, a medallion, and an all-expense-paid trip with a parent/guardian to Washington, D.C. in May. Ten of the state winners will be awarded an additional \$5,000 (plus \$5,000 grants for the charity of their choice). Students must complete an online application here and return the certification and signature pages to the School Counseling office. The selection process for this nomination-only scholarship will take place AFTER the student has submitted their application online. Two students per school may be nominated.

Deadlines: *Nomination form due BEFORE deadline of November 5, 2019

Gabelli Presidential Scholars at Boston College

The Presidential Scholars Program is a four-year full-tuition scholarship program for students of outstanding talent and character. Candidates must apply for admission by the Early Action deadline of November 1. There is no minimum GPA or SAT score requirement. However, they are looking for students with outstanding academic records, who hold leadership roles in their school and who are committed to and have a demonstrated interest in community service. Typically, the students selected are in the top 1-2 percent of the national pool of freshman applicants. For more information, go here.

Deadline: Must apply for Early Action admission by November 1, 2019

George W. Jenkins Scholarship Program at the University of Miami

Jenkins Scholars receive the full cost of attendance for four years of undergraduate study at UM. The award includes tuition and fees, on-campus housing, a meal plan, University health insurance, and a laptop allowance. Students may also receive a stipend for books, transportation, and personal expenses. This is awarded to high school seniors with strong academic credentials, significant financial need (by filling out the FAFSA & CSS Profile no later than December 1st), and a history of overcoming adversity. Nominated students must have a minimum unweighted GPA of 3.75. Open only to students who will be graduating from high schools in Florida, Georgia, South Carolina, Alabama, and Tennessee. November 1, 2019 - submit all freshman admission requirements if applying under the Early Decision I or Early Action deadline

Hesburgh-Yusko Scholars Program at the University of Notre Dame

A merit-based scholarship and leadership development program designed to equip young men and women as transformational leaders. The Hesburgh-Yusko Scholars Program (HYSP) is a highly selective scholarship and leadership development program for students who are passionate about making a difference in the world. The program offers four years of merit scholarship awards of \$25,000 per year, four fully-funded Summer Enrichment experiences, a community of scholars with special events and programs, and guidance and support from dedicated program staff and faculty mentors. Unique individuals with distinguished academic accomplishments, demonstrated leadership abilities, exemplary moral character and a sincere commitment to service will be chosen for this prestigious honor. Deadline: To be eligible for consideration, a student must apply for admission to the University of Notre Dame in either Restrictive Early Action with a complete application by November 1, 2019, or in Regular Decision with a complete application by January 1, 2020.

John Montgomery Belk Scholarship at Davidson College

Belk Scholars represent integrity, intellectual enthusiasm and excellence, global awareness, and leadership ability and potential. One or two students of demonstrated superior intellectual and personal achievement and significant leadership ability will be nominated by L&N for consideration of this prestigious award. The Belk Scholarship provides comprehensive funding (tuition, fees, room, and board) plus special study stipends that allow great flexibility in the on- and off-campus opportunities you choose to explore. The nominee must complete their admission application to Davidson no later than December 3, 2018. For more information, go here.

Jefferson Scholars at the University of Virginia

One nomination is accepted, per high school, for the University of Virginia's top scholarship competition. The award is for the full cost of attending the University and is renewable for four years. The nominee is from the senior class who best exemplifies excellence in the Jeffersonian ideals of leadership, scholarship, and citizenship. The nominee does not have to have a prior interest in UVA. Jefferson Scholar nominations are a binding early decision to UVA and therefore, nominees agree not to make an application to a college or university for early decision until Jefferson Scholars are selected. Students may, however, apply to colleges under regular decision. Students must submit an L&N Scholarship Nomination form in the School Counseling Office. Go here for more information.

Comcast Leaders and Achievers Scholarship Program

Danforth Scholars at Washington University in St. Louis

Unlimited nominations for students planning to apply to Washington University @ St. Louis who have exhibited a capacity for service and leadership, as well as academic excellence, and who will embrace the challenges for a rigorous academic curriculum. They are especially interested in students who exhibit the qualities of maturity, strong moral character, selflessness, and commitment to the community. Scholarships range from

partial to full tuition and are renewable all four years. Students must submit an L&N Scholarship Nomination form in the School Counseling Office. Go here for more information. GE-Reagan Foundation Scholarship Program

This program annually provides college-bound students with \$10,000 renewable scholarships — up to \$40,000 total per recipient. To be eligible for this award, applicants must demonstrate at school, at the workplace, and within the community, the attributes of leadership, drive, integrity, and citizenship. Students must demonstrate strong academic performance (minimum 3.0 GPA), be U.S.citizens, be current high school seniors attending high school in the United States (students living on U.S. Armed Forces base and homeschooled students are also eligible), and plan to enroll in a full-time undergraduate course of study toward a bachelor's degree at an accredited four-year college or university in the U.S. for the entire upcoming academic year. Semifinalists will be required to provide a recommendation from a community leader, such as a high school principal, elected official or executive director of a nonprofit organization, and must provide documentation to certify academic performance and financial need. Finalists will be interviewed via Skype or telephone by a member of the selection committee. Go here to learn more.

Professional Athletes Foundation Scholarship

The Former National Football League Players Chapter provides a \$2,500 scholarship to one deserving student—athlete. Each high school can nominate one male or female athlete for consideration. The student must have participated in varsity level athletics for at least one year and be a current senior. Optimist Club of Knoxville - Henry Naff Foundation Scholarship Program

Five to seven scholarships will be awarded ranging from \$1,000-\$2,000 to students attending a Knox County School. This is a non-renewable scholarship. To be considered the applicant will meet the following criteria: Plan to attend college in the fall of 2020, have a true financial need, possess a desire and ability to complete their college degree, have performed well in high school scholastically; and be actively involved in the community and school activities. If you would like to be nominated for this award, you must fill out an L&N Scholarship Nomination form and an application, both of which can be found in the School Counseling Office. L&N can nominate up to five students.

Deadline: Nomination form and application must be received by March 27, 2020 to meet the April 1, 2020 due date

Presbyterian College Fellows Award – Presbyterian College – Nominee must be a Junior This scholarship recognizes high school juniors who have demonstrated the potential for future success. The \$4,000 scholarship awards \$1,000 annually for four years of study at Presbyterian College. Selection as a PC Fellow also grants students consideration for other academic scholarships ranging from \$6,000 to \$23,000.

The nominee will meet two of the following criteria:

- One or more of the following test scores:
 PSAT (evidence-based reading, writing, and math) score of 1100 or higher
 SAT (evidence-based reading, writing, and math) score of 1100 or higher
 ACT Composite score of 22 or higher
- Ranked in the top 10 percent of the current junior class
- A weighted GPA of 3.5 or more

Regions Trust - Hampton Memorial Scholarship

Regions Trust manages the disbursement of these financial need scholarships. To be eligible to apply for this scholarship, the student must have a true financial need (you will need to provide your SAR from the FAFSA), be a senior, a resident of Tennessee, and plan to attend an accredited university, college or vocational/technical school on a full-time basis. The award is \$1,500 per academic year for a maximum of four years. L&N can nominate only one student for this opportunity. The application is an on-line process, but you must be nominated prior to beginning the process. If interested, stop by the School Counseling Office to fill out an L&N Scholarship nomination form.

Deadline: April 5, 2020, NOMINATION FORMS DUE

Furman Scholars – Furman University – Nominee must be a Junior

Furman Scholars are eligible for at least \$20,000 in scholarships per year, \$80,000 over four years, upon acceptance into Furman University. You must be nominated online by your guidance counselor in order to be considered for this program. You must be a current junior and meet the following requirements:

a weighted GPA of 3.5 or higher, significant involvement in extracurricular activities and community service, demonstrated leadership potential, a genuine interest in an education in the liberal arts and sciences, and one of the following test scores: SAT score of 1360 or higher (critical reading & math), PSAT score of 1360 or higher, or an ACT or Aspire composite score of 29 or higher. Nominations MUST be made online by your counselor.

Deadline: April 1, 2020 for counselor nomination, student deadline: March 25, 2020

Rensselaer Medal – Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute – Nominee must be a Junior

Their premier merit scholarship is the Rensselaer Medal, a scholarship opportunity worth \$100,000 for outstanding math and science students. For more than 100 years, Rensselaer, in conjunction with high schools around the world, has awarded the Rensselaer Medal to promising secondary school students who have distinguished themselves in mathematics and science. This merit scholarship, with a value of \$25,000 per year, is guaranteed for four years (five years for the B.Arch. program or the Co-Terminal Program) for each Medalist who is accepted and enrolls at Rensselaer. You do not apply. You are selected by your high school in the spring of your junior year.

Deadline: May 1, 2020

Wofford Scholars at Wofford College – Nominee must be a Junior

To qualify as a Wofford Scholar nominee, a student should be ranked in the top 10% of the class, achieved a minimum score of 1300 (Critical Reading and Math) on the SAT or a 28 composite on the ACT, and be active in leadership and service roles in their school and/or community. Qualified candidates are eligible to compete for scholarships ranging from \$10,000 per year up to full scholarship. Multiple L&N students can be nominated. Potential scholarship candidates are required to apply for admission to Wofford via Early Decision (November 1st) or Early Action (November 15th), must visit the campus prior to November 19th, and must attend Scholars Day on November 17th. Students must submit an "L&N Scholarship Nomination" form to your school counselor. More information can be found here.
