Administrations thoughts on moving all DE courses off Bearden's campus...

WHAT IS DUAL ENROLLMENT?...

- ▶ Dual Enrollment (DE) takes place when a high school student is enrolled in high school and college simultaneously. In other words, the student is approved for getting high school and college credit for the same class.
- Only rising juniors and rising seniors can apply to take DE courses. Dual Enrollment provides a means for high school students to accelerate their college education and get a feel for what learning will be like in college.
- With the help of the Dual Enrollment Grant, this process can save students time and money.
- ▶ DE courses are usually 2 days a week when the student is not attending a DE class, the student is permitted to come in late or leave early.
- ▶ DE courses are not listed as Honors or Advanced Placement courses on the high school transcript; however, they will receive 1.0 weight in the weighted GPA.
- All eligibility requirements and pre-approvals for dual enrollment MUST be met or students will be dropped from taking the dual enrollment course.
- DE courses are now taken on the college campus or online (they are no longer taught on Bearden's campus all are off BHS campus).
- ▶ DE courses must be scheduled during first or last block and must be preapproved by your school counselor.

WHAT ARE DUAL ENROLLMENT QUALIFICATIONS?...

- Only rising juniors and seniors can take Dual Enrollment courses.
- ▶ To qualify for students must meet one of the categories below:
 - ▶ 3.0 Unweighted GPA AND ACT subscores of 19 in Reading & 18 in English
 - 3.0 Unweighted GPA AND PSAT Evidenced-based Reading & Writing score of 500 – this category only qualifies to rising juniors if the ACT is not taken before DE course

WHAT IS THE DUAL ENROLLMENT GRANT?...

- ▶ The TN Dual Enrollment Grant is a grant program for the students that pays for qualifying students to take DE classes.
- For rising **juniors and seniors**, the grant will pay the below amounts toward tuition...
 - ▶ 1st & 2nd class up to \$500 per class
 - ▶ 3rd class \$200
 - ▶ 4th class \$0
- To remain eligible for the grant, students must maintain at least a
 2.75 college GPA (a "B" average).

WHAT COURSES ARE FREQUENTLY TAKEN BY BHS STUDENTS?...

- ▶ DE English I
- ▶ **DE English II** DE English I is a pre-requisite
- ▶ DE Psychology
- **▶** DE Statistics
- Other DE courses students should speak to their counselor, if other courses are desired.
- ► NEW FOR THE 2019-2020 SCHOOL YEAR: All DE courses will NOW taken off the BHS campus.

WHAT IS THE PROCESS TO ENROLL IN DUAL ENROLLMENT?...

During BHS Course Registration:

- Choose the DE course(s) that you plan to take when registering for your 2019-2020 courses on ASPEN indicate which semester you would like to try to have the DE course (in the "Notes to Counselor" box) & your DE application.
- Complete a BHS DE Application and return to your counselor by March 8th
- Plan to attend a "DE Day" Meeting (specific dates TBA) when those dates are announced
- Research / plan which institution that you would like to attend (PSCC / Tusculum)

March

- ALL prospective DE students MUST attend a "DE Day" Meeting this is where you will complete all items needed to take your DE course with a representative of the college, in which you plan to enroll. At these meetings, you will complete the following:
 - ► College (PSCC or Tusculum) application
 - Dual Enrollment Grant Application
 - Immunization Forms (for respective school)

WHAT IS THE PROCESS TO ENROLL IN DUAL ENROLLMENT?... (cont'd)

▶ April / May

► For Fall enrollment: Complete your course registration (through the college's registration portal – not ASPEN) & give a copy of your college course schedule to your counselor before leaving this meeting.

November:

► For Spring Enrollment: Complete your course registration (through the college's registration portal – not ASPEN) & give a copy of your college course schedule to your counselor before leaving "DE Day".

WHAT ARE THE PROS/CONS WITH THE DE CHANGES?...

- Pros: Since DE courses are now ALL off the BHS campus, we are able to offer more...
 - Opportunities students can now take DE courses at Pellissippi State Community College (in class or online) and Tusculum University (all online)
 - Course Options students have more courses to choose from since they are able to take the courses at the college campus
 - ▶ **Experiences** students now will have the full experience of taking a college course. They will be in the classroom on a college campus, and registering themselves (with our assistance / guidance) for their courses.
 - Similarities students at other Knox County High Schools take their DE courses on a college campus (L&N, Karns, HVA, & West) or online with other college students
- Con: The student must provide their own transportation to their DE course all other pieces of taking DE courses remains the same as in the past.

PAY NOW OR PAY LATER:

(If plan to start at a 4 year school)....

- ▶ 2 courses (6 hrs) in 11th = free
- 2 courses (6 hrs) in 12th = approx.


OR

1st term at a 4 year school:

- ▶ 12 hrs at UTK = \$5555
 - minus \$1,500 (Hope Schol.) =

approx. \$4,055
