How much does it cost to take our online Dual Enrollment course?

\$500 per course

What will the State's Dual Enrollment Grant Pay?

Providing a student is eligible for the grant award and has successfully submitted the grant application, it will pay the following

1. Course one - \$500.00
2. Course two - \$500.00
3. Course three - \$200.00 *
(remaining \$300 paid for by the TAG grant for eligible students)
4. Course four - \$0.00 *
(course paid for by the TAG grant for eligible students)

THIS COST DOES NOT INCLUDE TEXTBOOKS THAT MAY BE REQUIRED

* Tusculum University has implemented a new one time dual enrollment scholarship that may cover the out of pocket tuition gap for courses #3 and #4. The criteria to receive this scholarship are as follows:

1. Students can only have completed two dual enrollment courses. This scholarship is only good for courses 3 and 4
2. The two dual enrollment courses that have been completed are through the TEPSO program. Students who have completed one or more dual enrollment courses from another school are not ineligible
3. Students must have earned the state required GPA to remain eligible for the TSAC Grant

SUCCESS DATA

Between Fall 2015 and Fall 2016

High School #1

Average GPA 3.53

Credit hours earned = 273

Tuition savings - \$170,568.00

High School #2

Average GPA 3.35

Credit hours earned = 213

Tuition savings - \$131,634.00

What about using the HOPE Scholarship?

After the fourth course, a student can begin to use their Hope Scholarship money to pay for courses up to \$1,200 per year or \$600.00 per semester. Please keep in mind that this amount will be deducted from the Hope scholarship money awarded during the student's first semester in College. So in this case

1. Course 5 - The HOPE scholarship would pay \$300.00
(TAG would cover remaining \$200 if eligible)
2. Course 6 - The HOPE scholarship would pay \$300.00
(TAG would cover remaining \$200 if eligible)
3. Course 7 - The HOPE scholarship would pay \$300.00
(TAG would cover remaining \$200 if eligible)
4. Course 8 - The HOPE scholarship would pay \$300.00
(TAG would cover remaining \$200 if eligible)

In this scenario, the student would have reduced their Hope Scholarship eligibility by \$1200.00 for their first semester of college but would also have 12 hours of College credit.

What would a Dual enrollment schedule look like?

It could look different depending on how many courses you take but here is one.

Fall Term - Junior Year in High School	Direct Cost to student(not including textbooks)
Course 1	DEG Grant pays for
Course 2	DEG Grant pays for
Spring Term - Junior Year in High School	
Course 3	\$0.00 (providing they are still eligible to receive DEG funds)
Course 4	\$0.00 (providing they are still eligible to receive DEG funds)
Fall Term - Senior Year in High School	
Course 5	\$0.00 providing they are eligible for The HOPE Scholarship
Course 6	\$0.00 providing they are eligible for The HOPE Scholarship
Spring Term - Senior Year in High School	
Course 7	\$0.00 providing they are eligible for The HOPE Scholarship
Course 8	\$0.00 providing they are eligible for The HOPE Scholarship

This would mean that you could graduate high school with 24 hours of college credit

* To use the HOPE Scholarship money students and parents should know that this will reduce the amount of money they are eligible for during the first semester of college. A student can use \$600.00 a semester of their HOPE allotment after they have completed the 4th Dual Enrollment course. They will also have to maintain the required GPA to do this as well.
