<u>Classroom Library</u>: A variety of age appropriate books are available in the classroom for students to read and check out. Like the books available to check out in the school library, these books are not subject to the same approval process as instructional materials taught in class.

## **Additional Texts**:

Additional texts and resources will be pulled from local and national newspapers, magazines, and online databases. Magazines include *Time for Kids*, *Scholastic*, and *National Geographic Kids*. Specific databases include *World Book Encyclopedia* and *Newsela*.

## **Assignments:**

Students are required to copy assignments in their agenda books each day. Assignments are expected to be completed and turned in by the due date. Late work will be accepted no later than 5 days after the due date and will receive partial credit.
