Most selective colleges and many scholarship applications require a letter of recommendation specifically from a school counselor.

Although many state colleges and universities do not require specific letters, honors programs, scholarship programs, and students who need extra information in the application process will require these.

The attached forms provide me with additional information in order to write your counselor letter of recommendation. A parent/guardian may also use the parent information form to give me additional information he/she thinks might be helpful. The more information I have for you, the better I can assist you in providing colleges meaningful information for your application.

Be sure to:

- · Write clearly and legibly;
- \cdot Attach a resume of activities, community service, work experience, ect. if you have one
- · Remember any information you provide may be included in your recommendation.

Typically, it will take at least two-three weeks from the time your file is complete until the time your letter is ready. DO NOT wait until the last minute to turn in your form. Letters will be written in the order files are complete. This packet includes:

- · Student information sheet and self-assessment
- · Two teacher check sheets
- · Parent/legal guardian informational sheet (optional)
