## **New GHS Policies**

### **Advanced PE**

Students can take a maximum of 2 (of each type of) Advanced PE courses.

### **Peer Tutoring**

There is a **3.5 GPA** requirement to be eligible for Advanced Peer Tutoring.

Students can take a maximum of 4 Peer Tutoring classes of any type in high school (maximum of 1 per semester).

# **Ready Grad**

To be considered an "READY GRADUATE" by the state of TN, a student must complete one of the following by graduation:

- 1. Score a 21 or higher composite on the ACT
- 2. Complete four Early Post-Secondary Opportunities (EPSOs)

\*Scoring 31 or above on the Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery (ASVAB) counts as two EPSO's!

## **EPSOs**

Gibbs offers multiple opportunities to earn EPSOs including Industry Certifications, Advanced Placement (AP) classes, Dual Enrollment & Statewide Dual Credit.

**Industry Certifications** are earned by taking and passing a National Industry Certification test through many of our CTE courses. Some Industry Certifications are worth more than 1 EPSO.

**Advanced Placement courses** are rigorous, college-level classes taught by Gibbs teachers. To receive EPSO credit for an AP course, you must take the AP exam. It is also needed to potentially earn college credit for the course.

**Dual Enrollment** allows high school students to enroll in college courses for credit prior to high school graduation.

**Dual Credit courses** are the opportunity for high school students to take college credit—bearing courses. You must take the State exam to earn an EPSO and you must pass the exam to earn college credit.

  - You can take 4 classes without paying tuition. You can take up to 8 classes with no direct cost to you (besides the cost for course materials); however, classes 5-8 will each take \$300 from your Hope scholarship money.
  - IMPORTANT! You are ONLY eligible for the Tusculum grant if you take all DE courses through Tusculum.
  - Interested in nursing? You are **guaranteed placement** in their School of Nursing if you complete 3 of our Health Science classes with a GPA of 3.0 as well as 4 of their DE classes with a GPA of a 3.0.

# **Entering Requests Online**

#### Online Registration Instructions and Tips

From January 21-February 2, 2020, you will be able to view and enter your requests for next year's courses in the Aspen Student Portal. During this date range, you can enter and make changes at any time.

In order to enter course requests online during the window, students will need their Aspen student logic information. If you have misplaced your Aspen student login information, please retrieve this information from Mrs. Calloway in the library/media center prior to the online registration dates.

You will have an individual meeting with your Counselor to discuss your course selections. If you have questions about registering online, please wait to ask at your individual meeting with your Counselor.

#### To enter your requests:

- 1. Log on to the Student view,
- Click the My Info tab.
- 3. Click the Requests side-tab. The Requests page appears:



- 4. At the top of the page, in the Instructions box, read and follow the instructions for entering your requests. Note: If any of your courses are required or recommended by your teachers, they might automatically appear as requests when you first view the Requests page.
- In the Primary requests box, select your requests for the different subject areas. For example, to select your math course, click Select next to Math. The courses you can request will appear.

# Online Registration for DE Classes

- **PSTCC Courses** Most DE courses are listed by name in Aspen, so select the course(s) you want to take.
- If the course you're interested in is not listed, select "Non-Gen Ed Dual Enrollment". Indicate which class you want to take in the notes section to your Counselor.

# Online Registration Online Tusculum Classes

- To register for ALL DE Tusculum classes, you will select "Online Tusculum DE" as an elective.
- Indicate which class(es) you want to take by writing the name of the course in the Notes section.
- Remember, you can take 4 DE online classes tuition free if you take them all through Tusculum
