What is an Elective Focus?

READY GRADUATE

To be considered an "READY GRADUATE" by the state of TN, a student must complete one of the following by graduation:

- 1. Score a 21 or higher composite on the ACT
- 2. Complete four Early Post-Secondary Opportunities (EPSOs)

3. Complete two EPSOs + earn an industry certification (in an approved CTE program of study, EPSOs may be general education and/or included in a CTE program of study).

4. Complete two EPSOs + score 31 or above on the Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery (ASVAB).

HOW DO I EARN AN EPSO AT GIBBS?

- Industry Certifications
 - Industry Certifications are earned by taking and passing a National Industry Certification test through many of our CTE courses. Some Industry Certifications are worth more than 1 EPSO.
- Advanced Placement (AP) classes
 - Advanced Placement courses are rigorous, college-level classes taught by Gibbs teachers. To receive EPSO credit for an AP course, you must take the AP exam. It is also needed to potentially earn college credit for the course.
- Dual Enrollment
 - Dual Enrollment allows high school students to enroll in college courses for credit prior to high school graduation.
- Statewide Dual Credit
 - Dual Credit courses are the opportunity for high school students to take college credit-bearing courses. You must take the State exam to earn an EPSO and you must pass the exam to earn college credit.



Teacher recommendations are subject to change based on progress in second semester classes. Recommendations can be viewed in Aspen and will be discussed at your individual meeting with your Counselor.

If you plan on playing sports in college, make sure to let your Counselor know. NCAA does not recognize some courses, and it is your responsibility to let your Counselor know if you intend on being NCAA eligible.

Entering Requests Online

Online Registration Instructions and Tips

From January 21-February 2, 2020, you will be able to view and enter your requests for next year's courses in the Aspen Student Portal. During this date range, you can enter and make changes at any time.

In order to enter course requests online during the window, students will need their Aspen student login information. If you have misplaced your Aspen student login information, please retrieve this information from Mrs. Calloway in the library/media center prior to the online registration dates.

You will have an individual meeting with your Counselor to discuss your course selections. If you have questions about registering online, please wait to ask at your individual meeting with your Counselor.

To enter your requests:

- 1. Log on to the Student view,
- 2. Click the My Info tab.
- 3. Click the Requests side-tab.

5. In the Primary requests box, select your requests for the different subject areas. For example, to select your math course, click Select next to Math. The courses you can request will appear.
