Elective Focus Area Title (See back)		Write the title of the Elective Focus Area you have chosen. Remember, you must complete 3 courses in the same area by the time you graduate.
1. Elective Focus Course (see back)		You must complete 3 courses in the same elective focus area. <b>IF</b> the courses are numbered, they must be taken in order, so take the next course in the sequence of your chosen elective focus.
2. 3 <sup>rd</sup> Science or Elective		Biology, Chemistry, and another science (including middle school credit) are required for graduation. If a science is not recommended for you and you have not already completed the above requirements, choose a science (options on back). If you have completed those requirements, choose an elective.
3. World Language or Elective (see back)		World Language (French, Latin, or Spanish) is required if you haven't completed one yet. Choose an elective if you have met your World Language requirement.
4. World Language or Elective (see back)		2 <sup>nd</sup> Level of your chosen World Language required or choose an elective if you've already completed the World Language requirement.
5. Elective (see back)		If you are starting a new Elective Focus, consider taking the 2 <sup>nd</sup> course of your elective focus or PE if you have not taken it already.
