

Tusculum University Online Dual Enrollment

DUAL ENROLLMENT (DE) at TUSCULUM – Junior or Senior High school students enroll as a Tusculum student and take college courses online. Students must be self-directed and conscientious. As a DE student, you are a COLLEGE student, so we don't communicate with your teachers or have access to your grades. Your college GPA starts with these classes and performance in these courses will determine future DE Grant and Hope Scholarship eligibility!

WHY CHOOSE TUSCULUM FOR DE?

- *You can take 4 classes without paying tuition. Tusculum has a grant that covers the tuition not covered by the state DE grant, so you only have to pay for your course materials for those 4 classes. You can take up to 8 classes with no direct cost to you (besides the cost for course materials); however, classes 5-8 will each take \$300 from your Hope scholarship money.
- * **IMPORTANT!** You are **ONLY** eligible for the Tusculum grant if you take all DE courses through Tusculum.
- Interested in nursing? You are **guaranteed placement** in their School of Nursing if you complete 3 of our Health Science classes with a GPA of 3.0 as well as 4 of their DE classes with a GPA of a 3.0.

IMPORTANT NOTES:

- English Composition and Statistics courses have ACT prerequisites. All other courses do not.
- If you do not pass your classes with a B or higher, you will no longer be eligible for the state DE grant & you cannot earn it back
- As a college student/DE student, you are solely responsible for communication with the teacher and counselors do not have access to your courses or grades.
- The grades you earn in DE classes are calculated into both your high school and college GPAs.
