Does This Look Familiar?



Did you know that a child's temper tantrum is just another way your child communicates? Most tantrums come from children not getting what they want, family stressors, and/or fatigue. Often responses to temper tantrums are in the form of punishment (sometimes spankings) or to the other extreme, simply giving in to the child's every demand (big or small). According to Becky Bailey, the founder of Conscious Discipline, "Giving into children when they are having tantrums guarantee you will get more demanding behaviors in the future." If you find yourself repeating these practices over and over to no avail, consider these pointers. 1) Your first response is to discipline yourself first by breathing in and blowing out to release your own anxieties. Approaching the tantrum calmly will be the best first step you can take. 2) Show empathy by acknowledging the frustration and the reason behind the frustration. It's not to justify the behavior, but simply to acknowledge his/her feelings are real. 3) Give the child choices with your desire outcome. Ex. If it is time to leave a friend's house and he/she refuses. You will explain the choices. "You can either leave holding my hand or you can leave walking beside me without holding my hand." If he/she doesn'respond, restate the request using a firm, yet calm voice at least 2 times if neccessary. Your child will make a choice and your overall desire to leave will be accomplished. The key is to stay consistent. Sporadic discipline only creates sporadic behaviors. We encourage you to consider these tips at home. They have proven to be very beneficial at school.
