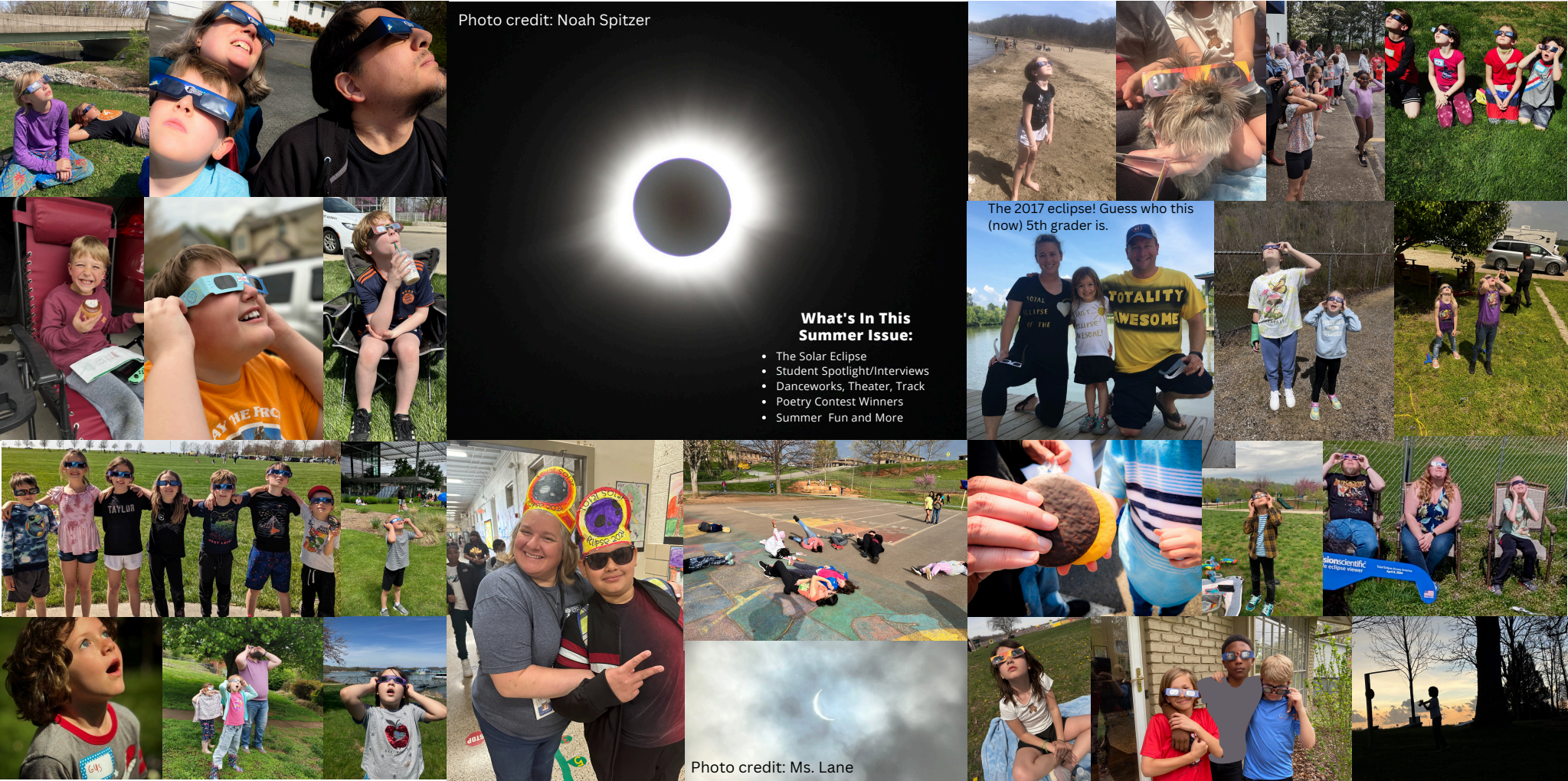

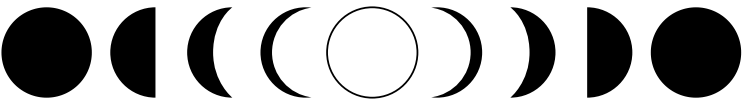
BMA BEARS LOOK UP DURING HISTORICAL SOLAR ECLIPSE

A historical solar eclipse occurred here in the U.S. on April 8, 2024. We consider it historical because we may only get to experience this a few times in our life. It was a cloudy that day in Knoxville, but some bears were still able to get a glimpse of the eclipse whether they traveled (some as far as Texas!) or caught a break in the clouds. A couple of our reporters researched what a solar eclipse is and found some really interesting information.

The solar eclipse is when the moon goes between earth and the sun causing the moon to cover up the sun and give a sunset feel to the skies. It's very important while trying to view the eclipse to wear protective eye wear. The sun can really damage our eyes if we look straight at it. Knox county schools gave students special protective glasses to watch the eclipse safely.

Some people like to go eclipse chasing or go to different areas to see the eclipse. If you weren't able to see the eclipse because the sky was cloudy because of rain, we've included pictures with this article so you can see what the partial eclipse looked like. For a total solar eclipse to take place, the Sun, Moon, and Earth have to be in a direct line. Unfortunately, we were not in the direct line of totality here in Knoxville and that is why some of our bears travelled to places like Texas, Kentucky, and Ohio to see it in totality.



Fun facts: If you're wondering when the next eclipse to appear across the U.S. will be, it will be about 20 years from now in 2044. Did you know that when the eclipse happens animals think it's night? Also, the traffic on the day of the eclipse is insane because people are traveling trying to find the best spot. We (Cathrine and Ellie) both didn't get to see the eclipse because it was so cloudy. But maybe next time!

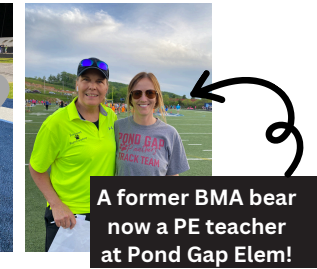

One Book Read City and Star Wars Day

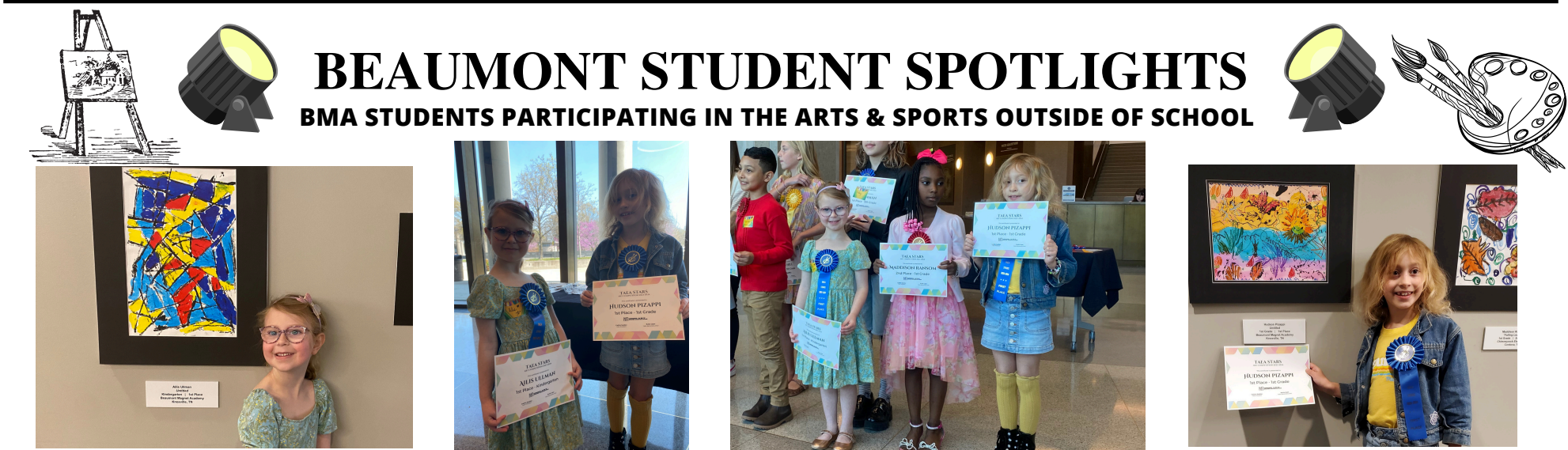


Students have fun as they kick of our One Book Read City event and dress up for Star Wars day!
