




What is an Elective Focus?



A grouping of three courses from the same elective area.

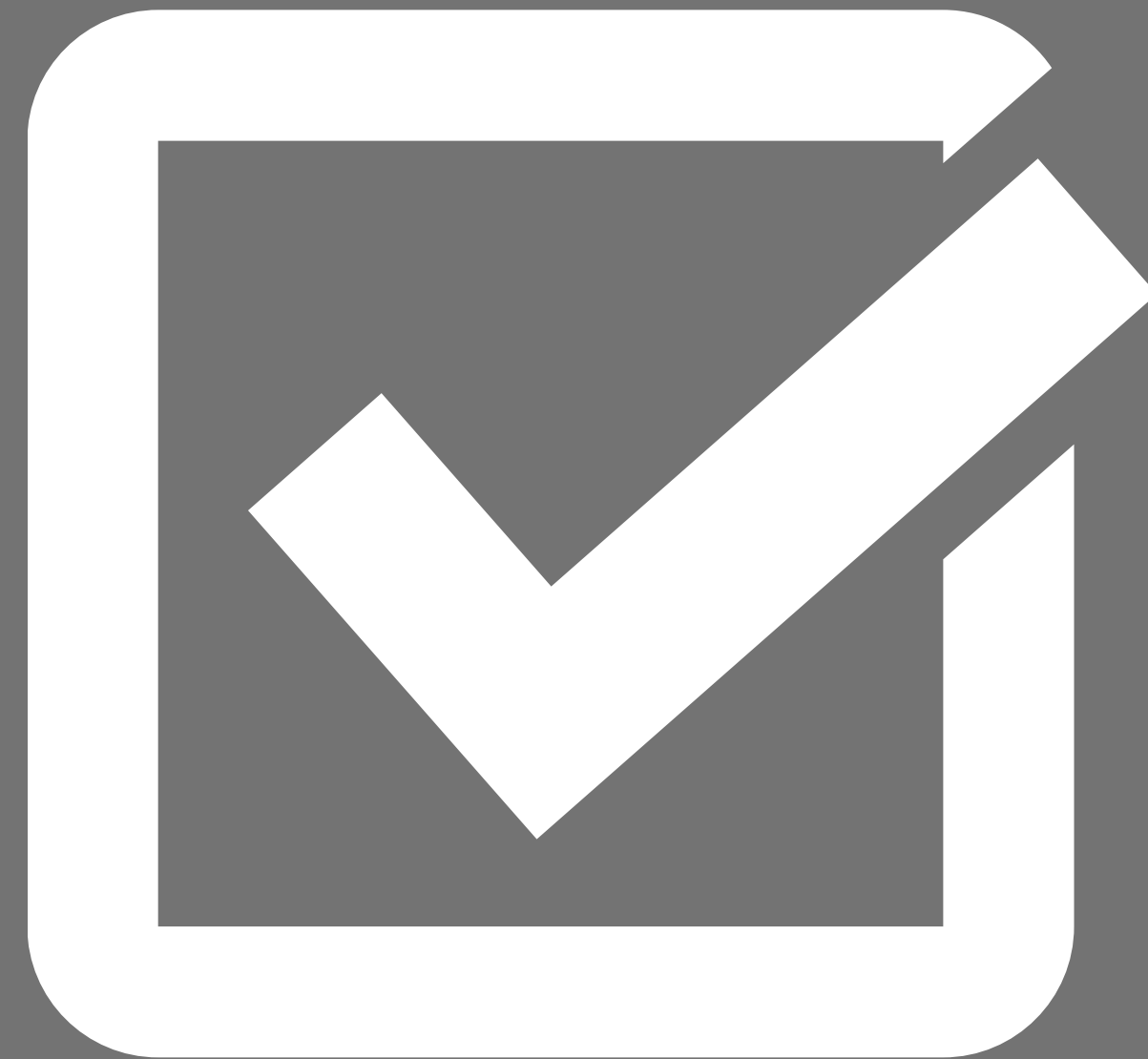

CTE Work Based Learning

Work-based Learning Requirements:

- The WBL course must be the third or fourth course in a CTE pathway
- The student must be at least 16 years of age.
- The student must maintain an attendance rate of 90% in school (YOU CAN ONLY MISS APPROXIMATELY 18 DAYS)
- The student must be on track to graduate.
- The student must complete the Intent to Participate Form by April 29th.
- The student must complete a portfolio by the end of the experience.
- It is **YOUR** responsibility to find an appropriate WBL placement before the semester begins. This placement must align with the elective focus/program of study and be approved by teacher/coordinator.
- Discipline record will be examined prior to placement in any WBL experience in order to support a safe work environment.

Interested? Then...

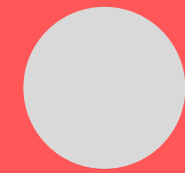
1. Talk to your **school counselor** or case manager to determine if you meet the above requirements. This conversation should take place **prior to the semester** of work-based learning placement.
2. Complete the Work-based Learning Referral/Intent to Participate form, obtaining school counselor signature and teacher recommendation. Obtain a recommendation from your elective focus/program of study teacher or case manager. Due April 29th, 2021

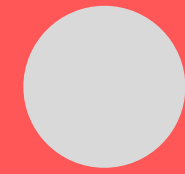

This program is coordinated by KCS, not HHS, so no guarantees. More information to come



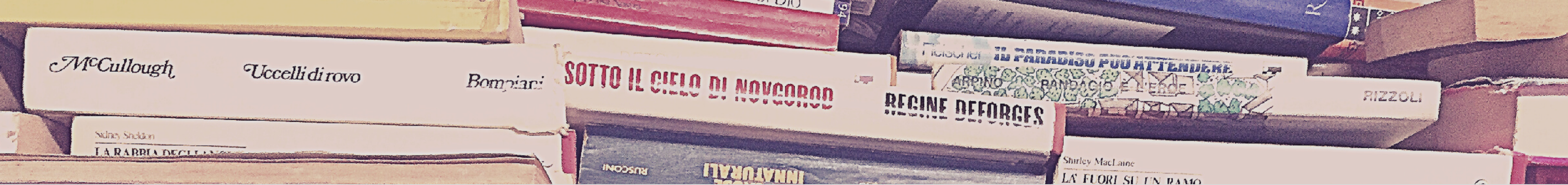

DUAL ENROLLMENT

As a high school student, you have the opportunity to gain your high school credits AND earn college credit too!

If you are interested, you can take from any university that Knox County Schools has an MOU with on file. Please use your individual meeting time with your counselor to see which program would be the best fit.

Students will be responsible for the cost of textbooks for each Dual Enrollment class taken.

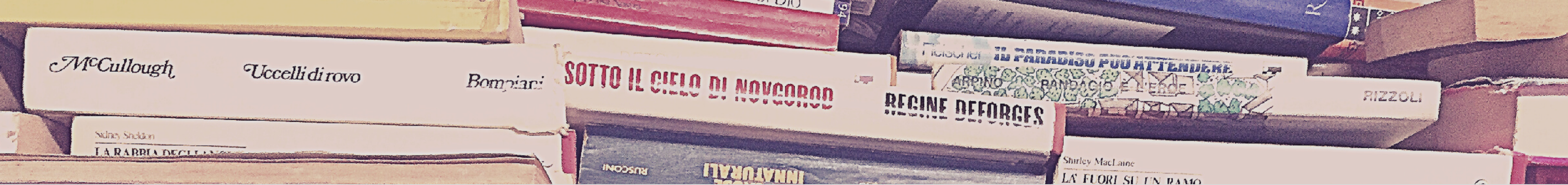


STEPS FOR DUAL ENROLLMENT

Make sure you meet the qualifications for either school you plan to take classes through.

Get familiar with the steps to apply. The Counseling Department will also bring Dual Enrollment coordinators to Halls High to assist in registration and applications for the College and the TSAC DE grant.

Complete the Dual Enrollment contracts and submit those to your School Counselor. If you are taking classes at Pellissippi's campus, ask about the "Off Campus Contract."



DUAL ENROLLMENT GRANT *HOW IT PAYS*

The state dual enrollment grant pays full tuition for two dual enrollment courses, and a portion of the third course.

Tusculum University will pay the remainder of a student's third course and fourth course, as long as student is eligible.

To remain eligible for the TSAC grant, a 2.75 GPA must be maintained in college courses

Some Universities use a plus/minus grading scale that could negatively impact GPA. Student is responsible for knowing the knowing grading scale at their DE college.

Advanced Placement

- **Best option for University bound students**

- More likely to attend and graduate on time when compared to peers AP Scores of 1 or 2 predict better college outcomes than academically similar college students who didn't take an AP course and Exam
- Students who achieve Ap exam score of 2, do significantly better in intro courses compared to academically similar students who don't take that corresponding Ap Exam
- Achieving score of 1 or 2 often earn higher score on the subsequent Ap Exams they take

FOUR-YEAR COLLEGE ENROLLMENT PROBABILITIES		
AP Students by Average AP Score	Academically Similar Students with No AP	
Average AP Score of 1	63%	47%
Average AP Score of 2	75%	56%
Average AP Score of 3	82%	65%
Average AP Score of 4	86%	72%
Average AP Score of 5	86%	77%

REGISTRATION STEPS

Step 1

Carefully select 8 course offerings and 4 alternates

- Core academic courses have been automatically enrolled or recommended in Family Portal (aka ASPEN, Family/Parent Portal)
- Select the remaining courses to fill in the 8 course offerings
- Students will still meet with Counselors individually or in small groups to review course selections.

Step 2

Level Change for Academic Release:

Complete only if you disagree with the core class teacher recommendations or need a Level Change; Found on the Website under “School Counseling” tab

REGISTRATION STEPS



Step 3

Review your transcript in the Family Portal, graduation requirements, complete the graduation checklist, and discuss course selections with your parents.

Step 4

Choose your selections online on or before **February 18th @ 3:30 pm** in Family Portal.

NOTE: No selections submitted means courses will be chosen for you.

REGISTRATION STEPS

Step 5

Click Post when you have made your final decisions. This indicates to your counselor you have made your final decisions.

Step 6

Don't forget to screen shot your courses when finished.

It also acknowledges you have discussed your requests with your parents.
