

Specific

 State exactly what is to be done with the education aspect involved

Measurable

Write the exact grade or class that the goal is for

Attainable

 Determine how it can be reached, which is often determined by academic work

Realistic

Do not set goal for something unattainable or unrealistic

Time Bound

Specifically state when the goal needs to be reached
