

To earn a credit you must earn


70%+

Honors, Advanced Placement (AP) & International Baccalaureate Diploma (IBDP) Courses

HONORS	Accelerated <u>College Prep</u> course 3 points added to final grade
AP	College level courses (not offered until 10th grade) 5 points added to final grade only if you take the AP exam at the end of the year
IB	College level courses (not offered until 11th/12th grade) 5 points added to final grade only if you take the IB exam at the end of the year

Lifetime Wellness

Required for Graduation

Topics covered:

- Disease Prevention and Control
- Mental Health; Nutrition
- Physical Fitness and Related Skills
- Safety and First Aid
- Substance Use/Abuse
 If you are taking ROTC for two years, you
 <u>will not be required</u> to take Lifetime
 Wellness.



If you are taking your world language in middle school for a high school credit, you must continue in that same language. Two levels of the same world language are required for university admission.

German 1 or 2 (Honors)


French 1 or 2 (Honors)


