Graduation Requirements

- 4 ENGLISH: English I; II; III; IV
- 4 MATH: Algebra 1; Geometry; Algebra II; 4th Math [math every year]
- **3** SCIENCE: Biology; Chemistry; 3rd Lab Science [4th strongly recommended]
- 4 SOCIAL STUDIES: World History/Geography [or AP Human Geography]; US Govt/Civics (or AP Govt); US History/Geography; (or AP US History) Economics ½ credit; Personal Finance ½ credit
- 1 LIFETIME WELLNESS <u>PLUS</u> a ½ credit of PE [via a class, BHS sport, Marching Band or ROTC]
- **2** World Language 2 credits of <u>same language</u>
- 1 Fine Art Art; Vocal Music; Theatre Arts; Band; Orchestra
- **3** Elective Focus [**3** classes in a common area]
- 22 specified; 28 total required; 32 opportunities to showcase your talent!
 - * Students must also take a Civics Test & Project Based Civics Assessment AND an ACT or SAT
