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What is RTI class?

In order to be fully successful and confident in the academic setting (and in life), students must be able to read and write independently and at grade-level. The purpose of this class is to fill in any gaps in the skill areas necessary for strong literacy: foundational skills, writing, vocabulary, fluency, grammar, comprehension, and spoken English.

We are using a research-based, proven-to-work program called *Language Live* that improves student progress in all seven skill areas.

Are you sure this class is for me?

- Students were placed into this intervention program using a number of factors: past TCAP performance, teacher input, past academic performance, and the AIMSweb assessment.
- Every student at CBMS last year was administered the AIMSweb test at the end of the year. Math and Reading proficiency is assessed through the brief 20-30 minute, computerized assessments.
- The same AIMSweb assessment is administered at the beginning of the school year; this helps us "catch" students who were not present last school year but also to confirm the test results.

What do Tier 1, Tier 2 and Tier 3 mean to me?

- > Tier 1 = student is on grade-level. NO RTI NEEDED.
- ➤ Tier 2= student is 1-2 levels below grade level. RTI IS NEEDED.
- ➤ Tier 3= student is 3 or more levels below grade level. RTI IS NEEDED.

How do I move to a higher Tier?

Language Live encompasses both a direct and indirect instruction components. We have a textbook and an online element we utilize to support student growth with students in Tier 2 and Tier 3 intervention programs.

Progress monitoring will occur a couple of times a month. Via the Aimsweb platform, students will engage in monitoroing of oral reading fluency with the interventionist. The other assessment is called the MAZE and is a short reading comprehension assessment.
