# 7th: Digital Media

Project Based Learning • 2019-2020

#### **Course description**

This class is focused on giving students authentic tools to navigate and contribute to the digital world that defines modern life. Instagram, Snapchat, Tumblr, Discord, Youtube... these tools facilitate socialization, information dissemination, and interpersonal connection in a very real way for people today. They use video, audio, and photo-based content delivery systems to inform, persuade, and influence their users. This class focuses on film analysis, composition, and research to help students develop critical thinking and visual literacy skills in order to excel in digital media careers and lifestyles.

#### **Course objectives**

Students will:

- Understand key components of analyzing visual sources for meaning, purpose, and accuracy.
- Apply basic understanding of compositional techniques to digital video and image productions
- Practice ethical research skills to create a shareable, informative product.

### **Pre Requirements**

This is a 7th-grade rotational elective course. It is offered in two 9-week sessions and one semester-long session. Students should be willing to work collaboratively, participate in discussions, think critically, and ask sincere questions. Learning is primarily project-based, so students should expect to be challenged creatively and authentically.

### **Materials Needed**

Students will need a composition notebook, writing utensils, and open-mind.
