

WHAT IS A CREDIT?

EACH CLASS = OPPORTUNITY TO EARN 1.0 CREDIT



<u>Opportunity</u> for 8.5 credits during 9th grade

HOW DO I EARN A CREDIT?



To earn a credit/make a class count = you must earn a 60% (or higher) for final grade


Remember: taking 8 classes doesn't mean you'll earn 8 credits. A 60%+ must be earned in the end – below 60% will result in zero credit & retaking class.

HOW MANY CLASSES DO STUDENTS TAKE EACH YEAR?

Students will take 8 classes per year + Yearlong Seminar

Four (4) classes in the FALL term ...

... then four (4) *different* classes in the SPRING term

The exception is if you are in Honors English & AP Human Geography. These 2 classes meet all year long; every other day for 1 credit each.

WHAT IS BLOCK SCHEDULING?





LIFETIME WELLNESS

- → Students will take: Lifetime Wellness -OR- 2 credits of NJROTC
- → This is a graduation requirement.
- → Topics covered:
 - Disease Prevention and Control
 - Mental Health
 - Nutrition
 - Physical Fitness and Related Skills
 - Safety, First Aid & Substance Use/Abuse











 → Students can take NJROTC BOTH semesters.
 → 2 NJROTC credits give you a Lifetime Wellness and the additional PE credits both are graduation requirements.

WORLD LANGUAGES

- → This is a graduation requirement: 2 credits of same language.
- → Freshman students who are on track to receive a high "B" or "A" in 8th grade English are permitted to select:
 - German 1 & 2
 - French 1 & 2
 - Latin 1 & 2
 - Spanish 1 & 2 ← NOTE: Spanish has limited availability
- → BHS recommends college-bound students / students who took 8th grade foreign language course to take a third level of the same Foreign Language during their high school career.



- → This is a graduation requirement: 1 credit of a Fine Art.
- → BHS Intro Fine Art options are:
 - Theater 1
 - Choir
 - Concert Choir & BHS Brothers in Song (no audition required)
 - BHS Belles (audition required)
 - Visual Art & Adv Art courses
 - Band/Orchestra prior experience required, **EXCEPT** Color Guard
 - Marching Band Woodwinds/Percussion (band camp required)
 - Marching Band Brass/Color Guard (band camp required)
 - Concert Band
 - \circ Orchestra



If student wants to take certain Fine Art electives all year, please select both parts, if identified by "Fall" & "Spring" -OR-

make a note in the "Notes to Counselor" box.

WHAT ARE ALTERNATES?.... WHY DO WE NEED THEM?

- → Alternates = If Plan A (top 3 electives) don't work, we need to know what courses you would like for Plan B
- → Students <u>MUST</u> give ALTERNATES! (minimum of 3)
- ➔ Availability is limited.
- → Not all classes are offered during all time slots.
- → Academics (core courses/grad requirements)are placed first & are priority.
- → Choose <u>WISELY</u>.



WHAT'S AN "ACADEMIC RELEASE"?

If you <u>disagree</u> with the academic placement/level that was recommended by teachers, you <u>must</u> complete an **Academic Release Form.**

→ <u>Electronic Forms available by request from Ms. Lee</u> – <u>leslie.lee@knoxschools.org</u> **Request by March 3rd!**

→ Required on Academic Release:

- Current Grades/Test Scores
- Rationale for changing levels
- Student Signature
- Parent Signature

WHAT HELPS **BHS STUDENTS** STAND OUT FROM THE REST?

- \rightarrow 8th gd foreign language and/or a college bound student? BHS recommends that these students take 3 or more World Language credits
- → Want to have the best ACT score possible?
 - Stats show that a BHS student who <u>take 4 sciences</u> (only 3 sciences are required) raise their ACT score an average of 4.5 points.
- Want to be more competitive to colleges / workforce?
 BHS recommends students take <u>1 (or more!) AP courses</u> in high school, especially if college-bound.
- → Be Bearden STRONG..
 - Support each other
 - Teach Kids
 - ◆ Reach out
 - ◆ **O**wn Your effort
 - ♦ Never Settle
 - **G**ive grace



FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS



- → Do I need Lifetime Wellness if I play a sport? YES (but sport can count for 0.5 PE credit, "Activity PE", which is an additional requirement)
- → Can I take honors in 10th grade, if I am not in honors classes in 9th? It's a possibility, dependent on Eng 9 course / teacher.
- → Summer Reading? YES for Honors (see list on the Class of 2027 page)
- → World Language? YES for Honors <u>or</u> if you've already earned a high school credit in Spanish or French
- → If I get high school level credit for Spanish 1 in 8th grade, can I take Spanish 2 in 9th, even if I'm not in Honors English? YES

WHAT'S NEXT?

- → Discuss your choices with your teachers and parents.
- → Attend the 8th Grade Parent Night (for rising 9th families) @ Bearden High on February 22nd.
- → Finalize entries in ASPEN by March 3rd.
- → Request Academic Release (if concerned about a student's Core course english, math, science, social studies) by March 3rd.
- → We will see your students at Bearden for the 8th Grade Visit Day on March 3rd. (student only event)


