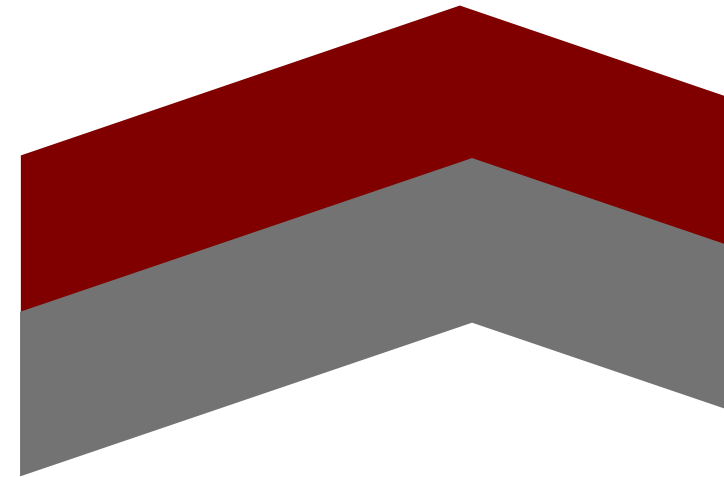

DUAL ENROLLMENT GROSS ANATOMY

Students will learn the gross anatomy of the following systems: skeletal, muscular, nervous, circulatory, respiratory, digestive, urinary, and reproductive.

The lab component of the course parallels & reinforces lecture concepts through the use of prosected cadavers. Lectures meet two times per week via mediasited lectures. Students also attend one 2-hour lab per week.
