- 1. *Anthem* by Ayn Rand
 - Annotation will focus on setting, characterization, plot, theme, symbolism, imagery, and foreshadowing.
 - Do not only highlight or underline. Always write in the margin the reason for the highlighting or color code your highlighting with key.
- 2. I Am Malala: The Girl Who Stood Up for Education and Was Shot by the Taliban by Malala Yousafzai and Christina Lamb (NOT the Young Readers Edition by Malala Yousafzai and Patricia McCormick)
 - Annotations will focus on Malala's major life events and the history of Malala's home: Swat Valley.
 - Do not only highlight or underline. Always write in the margin the reason for the highlighting or color code your highlighting with key.

Synopsis of each work:

Anthem by Ayn Rand is not just a story about the individual being swallowed by the collective, and it is not merely a story about the horrible, depressing life of people in a collectivist society; it is about the triumph of the individual's independent spirit and the triumph of those who reject the ethics of collectivism.

I Am Malala by Malala is the remarkable tale of a family uprooted by global terrorism, of the fight for girls' education, of a father who, himself a school owner, championed and encouraged his daughter to write and attend school, and of brave parents who have a fierce love for their daughter in a society that prizes sons. *I Am Malala* will make one believe in the power of one person's voice to inspire change in the world.
