7th Grade Honors ELA Summer Reading and Assignments

Welcome to 7th Grade Honors ELA. We hope you have a great summer, and we would also like to introduce your first requirements, which consist of reading a novel and completing two assignments related to the reading that will be turned in the **first week of school, by Friday August 9, 2019**. In addition to having completed both reading and assignments; these assignments will be graded. This will be your first ELA Honors grade.

Required Reading (Step 1): Please read the novel listed below for your assignment:

• All of the Above, by Shelley Pearsall

You will need to obtain the book *All of the Above* by Shelley Pearsall. This novel may be obtained through libraries, used or local bookstores, or online. They are currently available at the Knox County Library and through Amazon.

Project Requirements (Step 2):

Look at the essay questions and choose the one you want to answer. Then, choose the one Project Essay Organizer that will best help you to answer the essay question at the end. You will be completing this organizer as you read the novel and answering an essay question when you are finished. You will be turning in the organizer with the completed essay.

Choose One of the following Essay Graphic Organizers to complete. Choose the one that will best help you write your essay.

Option 1:

Character Chart-As you read you will be required to keep a character chart. Choose three of the main characters to describe their character traits and support their traits with text evidence. Make sure you include the page number next to each piece of text evidence. Refer to the character chart example using *Hatchet*.

Option 2:

Character Event Chart-After you read, choose one character from the story to follow through the book and describe the events they go through. You will want to choose events they are involved in or that might change their character. You will need to pick a minimum of three events, describe how the event changes the character, and include a piece of text evidence to support the event/change. You will need to describe the character at the beginning of the book and then again at the end of the book.

The following are examples of how you will complete the character chart using the novel Hatchet. You will do the same charts using the novel *All of the Above* instead.

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Character Event Chart:

Choose one character from the character chart to use. Character Brian

Describe the Character in the beginning.

In the beginning of the story Brian is a city boy who knows nothing about survival. He is scared and thought he was going to die.

Event #1 The plane is going down and Brian has to think fast in order to survive. He keeps the lake in sight and tries to land the plane on the lake.	How does this change the character? Brian realizes that he is a survivor.	

Text Evidence to support event #1 (include the page number).

"The crash is over and I am alive, he thought." (31) "I am alive, he thought. I'm alive. It could have been different. There could have been been death. I could have been done." (33)

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Essay Question Assignment (Step 3)

AFTER you have read your book and completed **ONE** organizer, you will select from **ONE** of the following essays. Before you write your essay make sure to refer to the Essay Outline. This will organize your thoughts before you write your essay. Then, use the organizer and outline to answer **ONE** essay question below:

1. Pick a scene in which you disagreed how a character handled a situation/person- Explain why you disagreed with how the character handled the situation/person. Make sure to use text evidence.

2. Which character is most important to the story? Using text evidence argue or explain why the this character is important to the story?

3. Select an important character from the story. Explain how the character has changed throughout the story. Make sure to use text evidence in your answer.

Planning Your Essay

As you begin to plan your essay, here are some questions that will help you develop your thesis statement. Using these questions will help you to complete the analysis process that is essential to developing an honors level essay.

- What were the reasons you disagreed with the how the character handled a specific situation in the book? What reasons
- What is the *cause* of the differences and *why* does it matter?

Requirements for the Essay

Your essay should contain an introduction, 3 body paragraphs, and conclusion. Use the outline to help you plan your writing. You should include evidence from the text to support your thesis and for your body paragraphs. Your essay may either be handwritten or can be typed you can also share it with your teacher through *Google Docs* (not required).. The name of your Doc – not the title of your essay – should be your first and last name and the assignment name. If you are not able to type, a NEATLY handwritten copy that is double-spaced will be accepted. Your essay will be scored using the TNReady Informational/Explanatory Rubric – Grades 6-8 from the state of Tennessee.

Google Docs *NOT REQUIRED

If you are familiar with google docs you are welcome to use it and share it with your teacher. You may share your reports with your teacher once you find out what ELA teacher you have at any time over the break – you do not have to wait until the school year begins: amy.layton@knoxschools.org or renee.bailey@knoxschools.org emily.dennison@knoxschools.org. When you share your Doc with your teacher, you'll need to click on the "Can edit" button and a drop down menu will appear. Select "can comment" then, share your Doc with me.

All assignments must be completed and turned in the first week of school.
