

GOLDEN ANCHOR AWARDS

In order to recognize and encourage the retention of outstanding educators at Farragut High School, the Education Foundation will be awarding grants to deserving educators. These grants are known as the Golden Anchor Awards (GAA). To be eligible for a GAA, an educator must dedicate a significant amount of time and effort over and above their regular teaching duties to enhance student learning and development.

Except as noted below, any current educator at FHS is eligible to receive a GAA. An educator may be nominated to receive a GAA by any teacher, student or parent of a currently enrolled student.
