

Farragut High School Graduating Class

The FHS Class of 2018 of 433 students has excelled in many ways. Seventy-eight percent of the class earned a grade point average of a 3.0 or better. Thirty-one percent of the senior class earned a 4.0 or better grade point average. Ninety-eight percent of the Class of 2018 earned some type of scholarship. The Class of 2018 has received scholarship offers totaling over 34.8 million dollars. A new record for FHS! The 2018 graduates will be continuing their educations at 95 different colleges and universities in 29 different states and two foreign countries, England and Mexico. Over the course of their time at FHS, this class has performed over 26,406 hours of community service – An average of over 60 hours per senior.

The class includes:

15 National Merit Semi-finalists; 15 National Merit Finalists (also a record for FHS); 1 National Hispanic Scholar; 11 National Merit Commended Students; 7 Eagle Scouts; 1 Girl Scout Gold Award; six students with perfect 36 ACT scores; a State recipient of the Daughters of the American Revolution-Good Citizen Award; and 5 US Presidential Scholar nominees.

The class also includes the Double State Science Olympiad Team Champions; principal musicians and concertmasters in the Knoxville Youth Symphony Orchestra; the Palmetto Regional Robotics Team Champions and World Robotics team competitors; First Place Coding team at CODE TN for the last two years; Dance Team TSSAA State Champions in Small Varsity Pom, runner-up at nationals in Small Varsity Pom, and National Champions in Small Varsity Jazz (First National Championship for FHS in any sport).

Class of 2018 seniors were also part of the Marching Admirals as finalists at the US Bands Southern States Championships and competitors at the Bands of America Grand Nationals for the first tie in band program history. Additionally, indoor percussion was recognized as semifinalists at the WGI World Championships. In world languages, seniors were named as National French Exam Bronze Medalists; National Spanish Exam Gold, Silver, and Bronze Medalists; National German exam Gold, Silver, and Bronze Medalists; and as a Russian Scholar Laureate. Seniors have also played on the state runner-up team in Girls Golf; played as Girls Soccer undefeated district and region champs; as Boys soccer district and region champs; and baseball district season champs. This class has several students enlisting in the Army, Marines, and Navy in addition to students earning service academy appointments and ROTC scholarships.

In 2017-18, Farragut had 74 AP Scholars, 35 AP Scholars with Honors, 80 AP Scholars with Distinction, and 18 National AP Scholars. This class helped Farragut High achieve its newest national ranking as #9 ranking in the State of Tennessee by *US News and World Report's 2018 Best American High Schools.*

School-Wide Summer Reading 2018

We're excited to announce our summer reading selections for summer 2018! The purpose of summer reading is to encourage our students to read for pleasure. All FHS students are required to choose one book to read for their summer reading assignment. New this year, Honors and AP English students may choose to read their assigned summer reading book for English in place of a book from the list below (except How to Read Literature Like a Professor, which cannot be used for summer reading.) A synopsis of each book along with pricing information and any potentially questionable content can be found in the FHS 2018 Summer Reading Flyer, available on the FHS website, to guide students and families as they choose a book.

Students will complete literary analysis questions about the book they choose. (Note: Students receiving special education services may be asked to read a specific book. ELL students and students receiving special education services may be assessed by an alternate method and may have an alternate due date. Please check with the teacher.) This assignment can be completed as soon as the student finishes the book. This assignment will be due to the student's second block teacher on Friday, September 7, 2018. The grade from the literary analysis questions will count for 2% of each student's grade in the 2nd block class. Honors and AP English students will complete the summer reading assignment about their chosen book to be turned in for 2% of the second block grade and must also complete additional assignments as assigned by their English teacher. There will be separate assignments for fiction and non-fiction books. The assignments will be posted to the FHS website in late May. Each student is responsible for downloading the assignment. All summer reading documents, including Honors and AP English assignments, will be available to students and families on the FHS website by visiting the "For Families" tab and clicking on "Summer Reading."
