<u>Courses</u>: Students can only take 1 course for NEW CREDIT. Students can only take 2 courses if one or both courses are for RECOVERY CREDIT. Students can only work on 1 course at a time

Dates: (8:30AM – 12:00PM each day)

Tuesday, June 1<sup>st</sup> through Friday, June 4th (MANDATORY ATTENDANCE)

Monday, June 7<sup>th</sup> through Friday, June 11<sup>th</sup> (MANDATORY ATTENDANCE)

Monday, June 14<sup>th</sup> through Friday, June 18<sup>th</sup> (Attendance determined by progress and average)

Monday, June 21<sup>st</sup> through Friday, June 25<sup>th</sup> (Attendance determined by progress and average)

Monday, June 28<sup>th</sup>-Wednesday June 30<sup>th</sup> (Attendance determined by progress and average)

Thursday, July 1<sup>st</sup> – Friday, July 2<sup>nd</sup> (Course completion and Final Exams)

Students who are tardy or leave early MUST have medical documentation or PRIOR teacher/administrator approval.

<u>Math Instruction</u>: Math students MUST bring a spiral notebook for note-taking during instructional videos. A math teacher will be available each of the scheduled days. Students taking a math course are highly encouraged to attend all sessions in order to receive assistance. Math study sessions will NOT take place outside of summer school hours.

<u>Transportation</u>: Students are responsible for their own transportation. Students who arrive early must wait in the outside breezeway or office lobby until one of the teachers arrives. The library is off limits without supervision.

<u>Course Completion Goals</u>: "Adequate" progress is when the student meets or exceeds the following goals AND has a C (75%) or higher OVERALL average In order to earn the privilege of working from home, a student must obtain the completion goal (see attached calendar) AND have the required average (75% or higher). If either of the two requirements are not met, the student MUST continue attending summer school on a daily basis until the NEXT progress

monitoring date. Teachers will be monitoring progress and averages on a weekly basis (Thursday evenings) and will contact parent(s) (Friday mornings) when there is a concern. Students taking more than one course will require accelerated progress. (For example, a student taking 2 courses is expected to have DOUBLE the progress for timely completion of their first course). Students must work on 1 course at a time (RECOVERY OR MATH COURSE FIRST). Switching back and forth between courses is highly discouraged. Teachers will not combine progress percentages in both classes in order to determine the attendance exemption. Absences will be unexcused and the course(s) will be dropped if the student fails to return when they do not have BOTH the required grade and percentage completion.

## Deadline for Course Completion: Friday, July 2nd

Students will NOT have the opportunity to work on a course(s) not completed until teachers return on contract on Monday, August 2<sup>nd</sup>. Resets for assignments will not be available until this date.

## Progress Monitoring Dates:

Thursday, June 10th (31.2% of course should be completed) (62.4% if taking 2 classes)

NOTE: Students with progress below 20% will be dismissed from summer school at this time

Thursday, June 17<sup>th</sup> (53.10% of course should be completed) (100% complete with course 1 and 3.10% into course 2 if taking 2 classes)

Thursday, June 24<sup>th</sup> (75% of course should be completed) (course 1 complete + 50% into 2<sup>nd</sup> course - if taking 2 classes)

Thursday, July 1st (96.9% of course should be completed and ready to take take final exam on July 2nd)

<u>Edgenuity Quiz/Exam Resets</u>: Student requests for quiz/exam resets on Edgenuity will be available until 9:00PM through July 1<sup>st</sup>. Students must be patient with these requests and expect an occasional wait. Teachers are not being paid after hours for this service. Do not email your teachers for resets. Frequent requests for resets in a short time period will not be honored.

<u>Grade Computation</u>: ALL tests must be TEACHER PROCTORED and therefore cannot be taken at home. As well, MOST courses will have a TEACHER-PROCTORED end of course test (EOC) that will count 15% of the final grade.

Initial credit: (Student has NEVER taken the course before)

Course with NO state exam: 100% Edgenuity

Course with state exam: 85% Edgenuity + 15% Edgenuity EOC

Recovery credit: (Student took the course before and made a failing grade)

Course with NO state exam: 25% original grade + 15% Edgenuity EOC + 60% Edgenuity

Course with State Test: 25% original Grade + 15% (Edgenuity or State) EOC + 60% Edgenuity

If the student has already taken the state test and scored 65% or higher, we will use that score.

If a student has already taken the state test and scored LESS than 65%, the student will repeat the EOC on Edgenuity.

NOTE: Any student who takes a credit recovery course can only receive a maximum grade of 70% upon completion.

<u>Discipline</u>: Students who display inappropriate behavior will be removed from the program. This includes failure to do work and disturbing the work of others.

<u>Athletes</u>: Edgenuity is approved by NCAA Clearinghouse.

## **Rules and Procedures**

- Attendance: No absences will be allowed without medical documentation. Nonmedical absences will be considered by the teachers and the administrator on a case-bycase basis. These requests must be put in writing and be submitted BEFORE the absence. Requests coming after the absence will not be considered.
- 2. No early dismissal without medical documentation
- 3. Students will be dropped from summer school on the 3<sup>rd</sup> tardy
- 4. All students must follow the rules of their teachers and obey any faculty member while attending summer school
- 5. Summer school is for completing course work. Students must turn in their cell phone at the beginning of class. Playing games or music on the computer and sleeping will not be permitted. One warning will be given and documented. Students will be dismissed if they exceed this warning.
- 6. All assigned work must be completed (EOC included) by Friday, July 2nd. It will be at the principal's discretion whether or not summer school work will be carried over into the Learning Center the following school year. Teachers will not be available for assignment resets until teachers return on contract on Monday, August 2<sup>nd</sup>. - 7. Fees are nonrefundable if a student fails to complete course work or is dismissed for disciplinary reasons.
- 8. Students must abide by all school rules and Knox County Board of Education policy including but not limited to:

- Student dress and grooming are regulated to the extent that they do not interfere with the educational process or personal safety as determined by the administration. The library is cold. Dress appropriately.
- The administration will provide information about parking. Students are not permitted to return to their vehicle or to the parking lot during summer school hours.
- Students in possession of a weapon will be dropped from summer school and turned over to law enforcement. An officer will be present each day.
- Students under the influence, in possession of, or using drugs or alcohol will be dropped from summer school and turned over to law enforcement. This includes the new vaping law.
- Students using or in the possession of tobacco products will be dropped from summer school.
- Valuables such as money, cell phones, purses, wallets, etc. are the responsibility of the student
- Students are not to be out of class except during scheduled breaks
- Students may bring or purchase drinks and/or snacks as long as they clean up at the end of the session
- Conduct by any student that is prejudicial to good order or discipline, as determined by the administration, may result in that student being dropped from summer school.
