Students are to complete two assignments that are due of the first day of school.

- 1. All students will read the Absolutely True Diary of a Part-Time Indian by Sherman Alexie and complete the attached reading guide.
- 2. Students will read an additional novel from the following list, and write a five paragraph essay answering the question, "How do life's struggles and triumphs shape our identities?" Evidence from **both texts** must be used in the essay to answer this question. The answer should analyze how characters in each texts dealt with answering this question, and how this question shaped the development of both novels.

- 1) You will be reading *The Absolutely True Diary of a Part-Time Indian* by Sherman Alexie.
- 2) Read until you come to a STOP POINT in the text; stop points are listed below:

 - **Stop Point 5**: pg. 167 (after "Wake")
 - **Stop Point 6**: pg. 198 (after "Rowdy and I Have a Long and Serious Discussion About Basketball")
 - **Stop Point 7**: pg. 230 (after "Talking About Turtles")
- 3) After each STOP POINT, answer all the questions in the **diary entry** for those particular chapters.
- 4) At the end of the book, answer the **final questions** on the last page of your packet.
- 5) All answers should be **in complete sentences**, unless otherwise noted.


