George Washington, Our First!




He became our first president in 1789. He was president for two terms (eight years).



George Washington was born in Virginia in 1732. He was good in math as a young boy. He became a surveyor at age 17.




He lived in Mount Vernon. You can still visit his home there.

He had a nickname. It was "The General." George Washington was "The Father of Our Country!"




Glossary:


surveyor: It is a person who studies, measures and maps the land. general: It is a high ranking officer in the army.


presidential term: It is a length of time that is four years long. nickname: It is a name that is not your real name. It is something that your family or friends call you.




- Using a highlighter or a yellow crayon, mark the sentence that tells what happened in 1789.

- Why do you think people call George Washington, "The Father of Our Country?" Tell your teacher or your partner your answer.




