Response to Intervention ("Reading RTI") Syllabus

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Course Description: Reading Intervention is a program designed to help students strengthen reading skills in the following areas: *decoding*, *fluency*, *vocabulary*, *spelling*, and *comprehension*. This program addresses individual needs through direct individual/small group instruction and the use of technology.

Students were selected for this course based primarily on the following factors: the universal screener (given 3 times a year), past assessments, grades, teacher input, and other data. The universal screener is the Aimsweb Plus test, which identifies students as either Tier 1, 2, or 3. Their definitions are as follows:

- Tier 1= student is on grade-level or above. NO OTHER INTERVENTION IS NEEDED outside of the general curriculum.
- Tier 2= student is 1-2 levels below grade level. RTI IS NEEDED.
- Tier 3= student is 3 or more levels below grade level. RTI IS NEEDED.

The tier in which your child is placed will determine curriculum used and assessments completed by the intervention teacher. These may include:

- Language! Live is a multi-dimensional instructional program, which combines both computer
 and targeted teacher-directed instruction for students in Tier 2 and Tier 3 intervention
 programs and those identified as having Dyslexia Characteristics. This component is
 designed to move students toward increased fluency and comprehension. This program
 can be used at home. The website is

 will be written in their agenda.
- Reading Plus is the second instructional program and is used to help students in Tier 2 to
 increase comprehension and silent reading fluency. THIS COMPONENT CAN BE USED AT
 HOME. The website is https://login.readingplus.com/. All students have a log-in that will
 be written in their agenda.

 Progress Monitoring Assessments: Aimsweb Plus is an online assessment tool for stu in intervention. Students will be progress monitored every two weeks. Student either be assessed using short fluency measures and/or comprehension measure depending on need and progress. 	s will
